US Presidential Candidate to Visit Wichita Tomorrow!

With all the attention being paid to the Republican side of the US Presidential race, it would be easy to forget that we still have a two-party system.

A Democrat whose name is well known nationally, Randal Terry, is running for the Democratic Nomination against Barack Obama, and he is scheduled to speak at a Campaign Rally at WORD OF LIFE CHURCH, in northwest Wichita on Saturday, January 21, at about 6: pm.

If Randal Terry rides the wave of Democrats who support Heartbeat legislation, the nation could be in for some surprising Democrat Primary numbers! Barack Obama does NOT support Heartbeat Legislation.

Heartbeat Legislation would outlaw abortion after an unborn baby's heart is beating, and after some other requirements are met. Unlike Personhood efforts, which would outlaw

abortion from the moment of conception, Heartbeat Legislation is expected to be upheld in the US Supreme Court.

Also, in much the same way that the "*Pain Capable Legislation*" was passed in Kansas during the 2011 Legislative session, Heartbeat Legislation can take effect without having to first reverse Roe v. Wade.
