New Abortion Facility to Open in Wichita – Location Still a Secret

Reliable confidential informants (*with documentation*) have informed The Kansas Coalition for Life (KCFL) that a new organization calling itself the “SOUTHWIND WOMEN’S CENTER” has purchased a building in Wichita, with the intent of opening a new Kansas abortion facility. The purchase of the building was made in mid-August 2012, and the center plans to begin doing abortions as soon as the facility is ready ...sometime between now and January.



Julie Burkhart, who worked with the late Abortionist Tiller for eight years and who is the founder and current director of the **Trust Women PAC**, has

been working to open a Wichita abortion facility since Tiller’s operation closed in 2009.

However, Julie’s biggest obstacle has been finding an abortionist willing to work in Wichita. But now, Julie not only has “an” abortionist lined up and ready ...but she has three of them!

One soon-to-be SOUTHWIND WOMEN’S CENTER Abortionist is a local physician, whereas the other two will commute to Wichita to work at the new abortion business, most likely on a part-time basis, but they do not currently live here.

The only thing that KCFL knows with certainty about the three abortionists is that **Mila Means, MD**, of Valley Center, an abortionist-wanna-be, is NOT one of the three abortionists who will be employed.

It is possible that the location of the new SOUTHWIND WOMEN’S CENTER will be in the building that once belonged to Abortionist Tiller, but it is equally possible that the location will be in another facility in an entirely different Wichita neighborhood. In either case, KCFL volunteers intend to be on-site to offer financial help, housing, and other forms of direct support to abortion-bound women who feel forced into having an abortion by circumstances beyond their control.

This grave announcement underscores the need for Kansas to pass Heartbeat Legislation as soon as possible.
