KCFL Calls for Immediate Morrison Resignation

KCFL joins Operation Rescue and Kansans for Life, in calling for the immediate resignation of Kansas Attorney General Paul Morrison.

This call is not a case of Christians throwing stones at one who admits to sin; rather, Morrison's failure to resign, in light of his own admissions in this sex scandal case, will lead an even greater number of Kansans to lose confidence in Kansas government.

Furthermore, if Morrison fails to resign, it will unavoidably and unfairly jeopardize all of the cases currently being handled by the State Attorney General's Office, both those related to the abortion issue, and those that have nothing to do with abortion.

Morrison's statement: *"I pledge to continue to fight for the safety and security of Kansans to the best of my ability..."* may be a genuine statement. However, Paul Morrison should do so in another capacity, far removed from the Office of Attorney General. Morrison's resignation would be a true indication that he indeed has the interests of the people of Kansas at heart.

Based ONLY on Morrison's admissions in this case, and assuming all other allegations to be false, the sooner Morrison resigns, the better it will be for him, for his family, for the AG's office, for the government in the entire State of Kansas, and for the many citizens who will be personally impacted by the

outcome of the many cases that the State AG's office is currently involved in.
